



Jobs Plan: Opportunities For All

Putting Money in People's Pockets

Earned Income Tax Credit – Continues to increase the EITC to 15 percent, benefitting more than 85,000 taxpayers, so working families can keep more of what they earn

Minimum Wage – Continues to raise the minimum wage from \$9.60 to \$10.10 per hour, affecting more than 90,000 workers, because no one who works full time should have to raise their family in poverty

Home Care & Developmental Disability Workers – works to raise wages of Medicare Home Health Workers by approximately 7 percent with a \$4 million investment and direct care workers in the private developmental disability provider network by approximately 4 percent with a \$5 million investment

Keeping People Healthy

Meals on Wheels – Continues to fully fund program with \$550,000 so seniors and others in need can stay healthy and nourished in their homes

Senior Centers – Increases funding to \$600,000 for senior centers so our communities can benefit from essential services like rehabilitation counseling, continuing education and other services

Helping Rhode Islanders Move From Addiction to Recovery

- Takes steps to reduce overdose deaths and prevent addiction
- Supports recovery centers and formal training for peer recovery coaches
- Invests \$2.5 million in medication-assisted treatment for substance abuse at the Adult Correctional Institute
